#### **Generalising From Qualitative Research**

Qualitative researchers are not exempt from this phenomenon • Inappropriate to mimic quantitative concepts and forms of generalisation • Generalisation is socially constructed and must account for environmental complexities across time & space • Other means of drawing inferences and extrapolating beyond research site actors and context •
